A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

When staging Shakespeare, I must find why the play is relevant to a modern audience, and how to express a classic in a new, yet relatable, way. The play's themes of dark and light, instability, unchecked ambition resonate with us today just as they did with the original 17th Century audiences. We have all watched world leaders bent on their own glorification, to the disregard and detriment of all others. We have all watched seemingly enduring institutions eroded by greed, ambition, calamity. We have all watched the rise of self-interest.

Our post-apocalyptic MacBeth, as a tragedy, takes all these evils and distills them. The stark reality of a devastated world highlights the personalities and urges of our cast of characters. Through them, we are reminded that there will always be those who seek to profit, to hoard, to grasp. And, when resources are scarce, this selfishness abounds.

Fortunately, Shakespeare doesn't leave us in the dark. Although many horrors have been unleashed, we are reminded that MacBeth's followers "move only in command, nothing in love." The resistance to tyranny offers hope for a better tomorrow. Duncan's sons, Banquo's progeny – these generations will overcome the sins of their ancestors. They have been raised by those who think of others, who lead by example, who strive for the good of all.

This was Shakespeare's hope, and it can be ours. There is always light. There is always good. There is always hope. We will keep doing "this and what needful also that calls upon us by the grace of Grace. We will perform in measure, time, and place."
